Gary is a leading authority on color reproduction and print quality. His contributions to the printing industry in these fields have been widely recognized through several prestigious and professional awards. Professor Field earned several qualifications in Melbourne, Australia before persuing the Fellowship and Insignia Award in Technology from the City and Guilds of London Institute. He holds an MBA degree from the University of Pittsburgh and an Accredited Senior Imaging Scientist certification from the Royal Photographic Society.

Kevin joined Clegg Industries, Inc. in 1997 and helped launch Americhip, Inc. in 2001 with his brothers John and Tim. An integral part of new product development, Kevin works closely with the Tech Department and Americhip's supply chain to create and develop new product applications. Kevin also oversees the international selling offices across five continents. Kevin earned a B.A. in American Studies from the University of Notre Dame and a J.D. with High Honors, Order of the Coif, from Case Western Reserve, School of Law.





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
